Saturday – Day 1 **“The God Who Restores”**

Experiencing God’s Renewal

Primary Text: **Psalm 23:1–3, Isaiah 40:29-31**

A. The Shepherd’s Heart

- Psalm 23 depicts God as a personal, caring Shepherd - not distant or demanding
- Restoration begins with relationship: *“The Lord is my shepherd”*
- God’s renewal flows from His character, not our performance
For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, (Ephesians 2:8)

B. “He Restores My Soul” — What Does That Mean?

Biblically, *soul* refers to:

- Inner life (emotions, thoughts, identity)
- Spiritual strength
- Desire and will

“To Restore” means:

- To bring back to original condition
- To revive, repair, refresh
- To heal what is broken or depleted

God restores through:

▪ **His presence**

You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; At Your right hand are pleasures forevermore. (Psalm 16:11)

▪ **His word**

The law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul; The testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple; (Psalm 19:7)

▪ **Quietness and rest** (Isaiah 30:15)

▪ **Forgiveness and grace**

Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and uphold me by Your generous Spirit. (Psalm 51:12)

C. Why We Need Restoration

The soul becomes weary from:

- Sin or guilt
- Stress, anxiety, overwhelmed
- Disappointment and grief

Renewed and Restored

- Ministry burnout
- Physical exhaustion
- Striving for approval

Sheep wander and become distressed; the Shepherd restores them gently

D. God's Process of Renewal – Restoration Requires Surrender

- He slows us down — *“He maketh me to lie down”*
- He refreshes us — *“He leadeth me beside the still waters”*
- He re-aligns us — *“He restoreth my soul”*

Restoration is not instant; it is a **process of cooperation** with God

“Restoration is not a moment - it is a lifestyle with the Shepherd”

Discussion Questions

1. What areas of your life feel depleted or in need of God's restoration?
2. What prevents you from resting in God's presence?
3. When has God restored you in the past? Was God's restoration what you expected?
4. Which of the Shepherd's actions (making you lie down, leading beside quiet waters, restoring, guiding) speaks to your current season?
5. How does the world outside of Christ view renewal and restoration?

Sunday – Day 2 **“He Leads Me in Paths of Righteousness”**
Living a Restored Life

Primary Text: Psalm 23:3; John 10:1–11

*The Lord will guide you continually, And satisfy your soul in drought,
And strengthen your bones; You shall be like a watered garden,
And like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail. (Isaiah 58:11)*

Introduction

- Restoration always leads to transformation
- Learn how to walk daily in the “paths of righteousness”
- Commit to habits that maintain spiritual renewal

A. Restoration Leads to Righteous Living

- God doesn’t restore us so we can stay the same - He restores us to **guide us** so that in return we would serve and worship Him
- “Paths of righteousness” = paths of right living, integrity, holiness, purpose, sacrifice
- Restored life must be a directed life
 - God’s healing is always connected to God’s leading
 - Often, we want restoration but want to choose our own path
- It is God who leads; we follow

B. What Are “Paths of Righteousness”?

Paths that include:

- Obedience to God
- Choices that reflect Christ
- Walking in love, purity, truth, humility
- A life shaped not by feelings but by God’s direction

C. Walking God’s Path in a Distracting World

Challenges we face:

- Temptation
- Cultural pressure
- Busyness
- Emotional fatigue
- Old habits trying to return

The Shepherd leads, but the sheep must follow

D. How to Maintain a Renewed and Restored Life

Pine Valley - 2026 Lessons

Renewed and Restored

1. Daily time with the Shepherd (prayer, Scripture, worship)
2. Community — accountability and fellowship
3. Sabbath rhythms — rest and worship time
4. Guarding the mind

Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. (Philippians 4:8)

5. Obedience in small things
6. Listening for God's voice

And when he brings out his own sheep, he goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. (John 10:4)

E. “For His Name’s Sake”

- Our restoration reflects God's nature and brings Him glory
- Our walk becomes a testimony of God's faithfulness
- A transformed life reveals the Shepherd to others

3. Discussion Questions

1. How can you determine “paths of righteousness” is God calling you to walk in?
2. Why do we need to be guided along the paths?
3. In what areas do you struggle to follow God's leading? How can our shortcomings impact the world's perception of “His name's sake”?
4. What habits help you stay spiritually renewed?
5. What changes can you make to protect your restored soul?
